Planning application for: 158 STERLING RD

Site

The site is located in the industrial area north of Dundas Street West, south of Bloor Street, between the two rail corridors, along Sterling Avenue. The total area of the site is 31,459 square metres and it is vacant with the exception of the historically designated, 10-storey, Northern Aluminum Company Building.

Proposal

The application is to permit a mixed use development with 750 residential units and approximately 74,000 square metres of commercial space. The site is currently designated and zoned for employment and industrial uses and therefore the applications are to amend the

Official Plan and the Zoning By-law to allow the residential uses. Included in the proposal are 1,244 parking spaces, a new public road through the site, access to the railpath and new parkland. The historic Northern Aluminum Company Building is proposed to have 3 floors added to the top and will contain commercial uses on the first two floors with residential units above.
