Background:

The City of Toronto has initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study (Schedule "C") to determine possible locations for the construction of a pedestrian/cyclist link through the CN/CP railway corridor between Atlantic Avenue and Strachan Avenue, along with a workplan for achieving this pedestrian/cyclist link. The link is to be accessible to all pedestrians and cyclists. A pedestrian/cyclist link would result in an enhanced pedestrian and cyclist environment, allowing for improved access between the communities north and south of the CN/CP railway tracks.

The study area is bounded by Queen Street West to the north, CN railway corridor to the south, Strachan Avenue to the east and Atlantic Avenue to the west as shown in the map.




